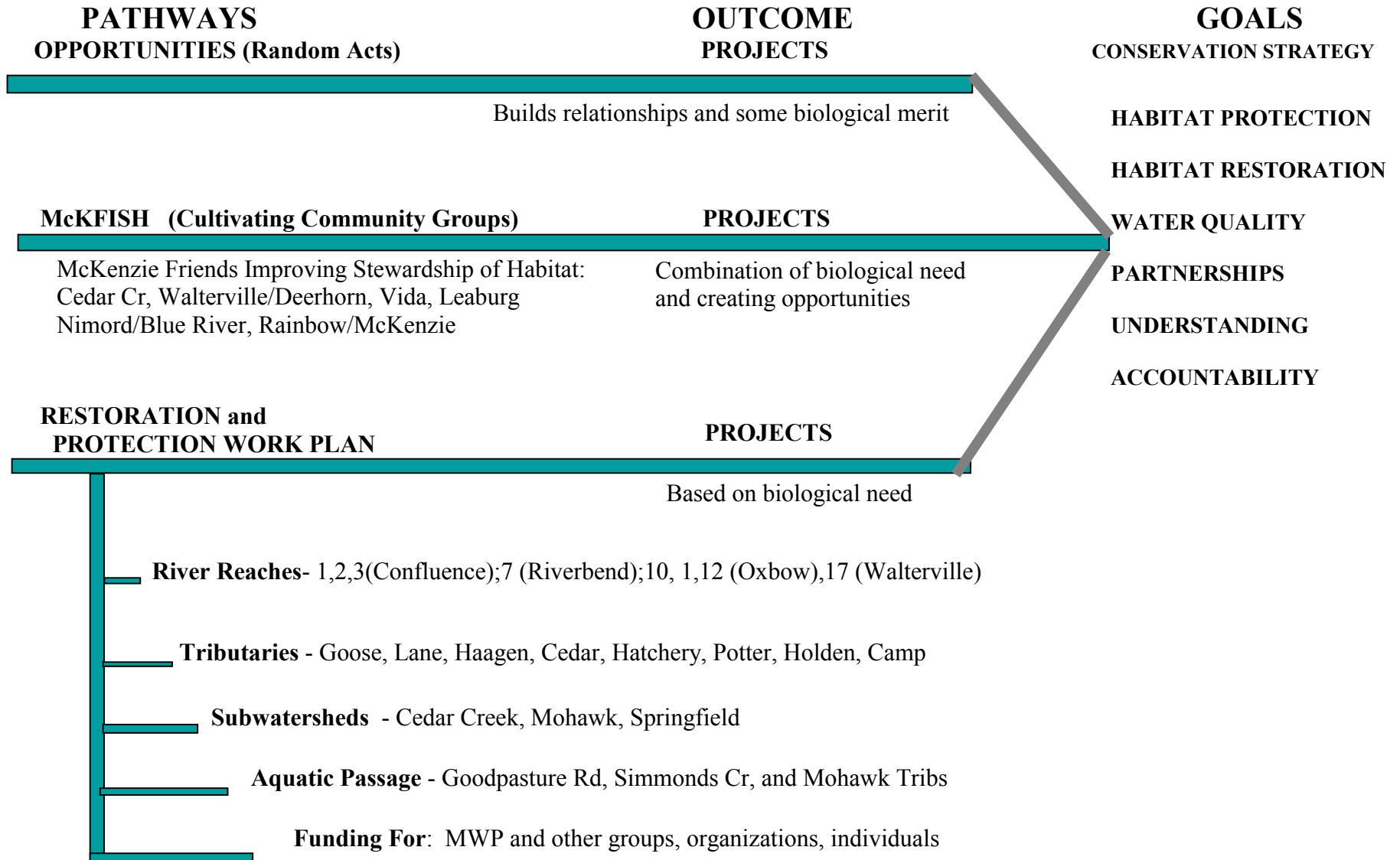

WHY?

- Focuses funding requests based on biological need

 - ▶ Agreements
- TAKES TIME AND NURTURING and BUMPS
- Focuses Staff and Council Partner Resources toward common place and goal (Strategic)
- Recognition of BPA funding/proposal process in 2003 and beyond - 3 year cycles
- Realistic - Decision process of: Principled, Practical, and Political
 - ▶ Annual deliverables provided in Council's Annual Work Plan
 - ▶ Provides Accountability to Staff and Council
